#### Official Rules

- The person changing the diaper must be 18 or older.
- One baby per adult (if you have twins or more than one kiddo in diapers, invite a spouse or friend to change one of them).
- Baby being diapered must be 39" tall or shorter
- The clean diaper must be 100% reusable and commercially available (you must be able to purchase the brand you change your baby into in a store or online)

Each year billions of disposable diapers enter landfills where it takes hundreds of years for them to decompose, according to the **Real Diaper Association**. In the U.S. and Canada, nearly 90% of babies are diapered in disposable diapers, meaning 60,000 diapers will enter landfills during the ONE MINUTE we'll be changing diapers on April 21st.
